Lake Anasagunticook Erosion Control Project Extended

The LAA continues to take the lead to protect water quality in the lake and surrounding watershed. In 2019, the lake association coordinated a survey to document erosion problems, which, in turn, led to an intensive erosion control project that began in January 2021. The "Lake Anasagunticook Watershed Protection Project, Phase II" was originally slated to end on Dec. 31, 2022, but has been extended one year to allow for the completion of critical erosion control work on Pinewood Drive and Bonney Road. This project raised a total of \$86,009 (\$51,655 in federal grant funds + \$34,444 in local match). LAA has been the key local partner since its inception. To date, the project has led to the reduction in sediment loading to the lake of 33 tons annually, and the planting of 117 feet of shoreline plant buffers. Hartford Beach Policy (as of January 19, 2023)

The following rules shall apply to the use of the Hartford, Maine beach and parking area:

- A. Only residents/property owners of the Town of Hartford may obtain parking passes for use of the Hartford Beach. Resident Pass Fee=\$15.00 annually.
- B. Only residents/property owners of the Town of Hartford may request guest passes for their guests. Guest Pass fee=\$5.00/ day or \$10.00/week. Maximum=1 week per Guest Pass.
- C. Guest is defined as a person invited to visit the beach with the resident/property owner.
- D. Beach parking passes must be purchased at the Hartford Town Office and must be displayed on the vehicle in order to park on property along Thompson Lane.
- E. Swimming Lesson participants may purchase a pass for the remainder of the season, once lessons are completed, at the Hartford Town Office. Swim Lesson Pass=\$20.00.
- F. Organized groups shall request prior Select Board approval for proposed use of the parking/beach area for private group activities that use or occupy significant portions of the parking/beach area and that may hinder or interfere with the general public use of the parking area/beach. The Board may impose conditions on the proposed use for public health, safety and welfare, and maintenance of the beach.
- G. Permit requests for use of all or a portion of the property by groups for organized public events shall be submitted to the Select Board and the Board may impose conditions on the proposed use for public health, safety and welfare, and maintenance of the beach.

Be sure to visit the Town Office to purchase passes before visiting the Beach in 2023. Offenders will receive a warning letter first, citation second, and then the vehicle will be towed.
