With the Watershed Grant Award behind us – the hands-on work has begun and we are about ½ way through! A Steering Committee has formed and an initial meeting held –there is still room to join if you are interested.

Canton Bi-Centennial saw a strong LAA presence



Support our Loons!



We are talking about our feathered friends who spend the spring/summer/fall on the lake. We encourage NO WAKE ZONES in the mill pond and along nesting areas on the west side of the lake. This past year the number of new chicks appeared to be lower than before. PLEASE, PLEASE, PLEASE help protect their habitats and help them continue to breed in safety.

Human impact on these birds varies based upon region and species. **Habitat destruction and pollution** make it difficult for loons in some areas to find food or nesting sites. Loons also accidentally eat lead sinkers abandoned while fishing, which can cause lead poisoning. Let's do our best to help them feel welcome!

LAKE SMART

WHAT IS LAKESMART?

LakeSmart is an education and reward program that helps lakefront homeowners manage landscapes in ways that protect water quality. The program is free, non-regulatory, and voluntary. Participating homeowners receive individualized suggestions for keeping pollutants in stormwater out of lake waters.

Maine Lakes partners with lake associations to deliver LakeSmart education property-by-property and shore-by-shore to create a conservation ethic across lake communities. Trained volunteers perform property assessments for participating homeowners. Sites that score well earn the coveted LakeSmart Award, consisting of two distinctive signs that can be posted at the waterfront and driveway. The signs identify the homes of good stewards and illustrate what lakefriendly living looks like.
