Letter from the LAA President Mike McCluskey

Much has happened around the lake and with the Lake Anasagunticook Association (LAA) since our last newsletter. Heavy rains in late December provided challenges, not only on lakefront properties, but to other residents in Hartford and Canton. We were fortunate that the lake level was low before the rain; this helped to limit some of the damage. Regardless, basement flooding and road closures impacted almost everyone. I learned firsthand the difficulties of pumping out a basement and the need to quickly get rid of wet sheetrock, insulation, and damaged property. Lakefront property owners may find storm debris when they return. This is because when the water recedes, it pulls tree limbs, leaves, and other floating items onto the shoreline.

I want to thank the Board for its efforts in keeping LAA activities moving forward during the winter season. Many lake organizations would be inactive during the "off season."

- At the Annual Meeting in August, LAA members expressed their desire for the Board to pursue a second grant to minimize erosion and unhealthy chemicals entering the watershed. With the previous grant funds, we worked with the towns of Hartford and Canton to significantly reduce harmful impacts in the watershed. But because Mother Nature will continue to present challenges, the Board is working to obtain some financial and technical assistance through the next round of grants from the State of Maine. These grants require us to obtain cash or in-kind contributions. The Board is soliciting contributions from area businesses, but we will also require contributions from individuals. Please consider making a personal donation designated for this project. To do so, please see page 4.
- The LakeSmart program that provides voluntary on-site property evaluations continues. Suggestions are made to property owners about how to improve harmful runoff, although implementation is optional. In some cases, volunteers may be available to help with the recommended changes. - The Membership Committee has been working to expand the membership base and raise awareness of the work that is being done to benefit our members and the lake. If you are not a member, please consider joining using one of the methods explained on page 6.
- Thanks go to board member Wes Barry who obtained a grant from Microsoft resulting in new e-mail accounts and access to multiple copies of MS Office!
- Water quality monitoring continues on a regular basis and was expanded recently to include readings in the winter.
- By-laws and strategic plan reviews are underway to ensure the documents meet the association's current needs and requirements.
- The association provides social means for members to stay connected with their neighbors as well as make the acquaintance of people they have not yet met. Lake Days are held in August and feature games, raffles, and other activities geared to making life around the lake more enjoyable.

Who Are We?

We are the Lake Anasagunticook Association (LAA). The LAA is a public, nonprofit organization that brings together people who care about Lake Anasagunticook—aka "Canton Lake." The lake has a depth of 50 feet and occupies 600 acres in the towns of Canton and Hartford, Maine. It is used for recreational purposes, including boating, swimming, and fishing, and is a source of drinking water. The LAA is concerned with the preservation and protection of the lake as a natural resource and the surrounding watershed. Fundraisers and member donations are our primary sources of funding. The organization monitors water quality, pursues invasive plants and animals, communicates with citizens via public meetings and newsletters, and holds an annual Lake Days celebration.

Save the Date for a History Hour & Spaghetti Dinner


The LAA and the Canton Historical Society team up for an event!

It Went So Well, Let's Do It Again!

The LAA is applying for additional erosion control funds

Fresh off the success of the erosion control grant that ended last year, LAA and the Androscoggin River Watershed Council (ARWC) plan to apply for another erosion control grant this spring. If awarded, this new grant will begin in January 2025, and run for two years.

In the previous grant, LAA was the key local partner in a coalition that reduced soil loading to the lake from its surrounding watershed by 44 tons annually. Maine Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) studies show soil erosion is the primary threat to lakes in the Pine Tree State. Too much soil erosion entering a lake unleashes a disastrous chain of events that can result in a bloom of algae that ruins water quality, recreation, and even shoreline property values.

Lake Anasagunticook is right on the edge, having experienced brief, localized algae blooms in recent decades. There is even more at stake for Lake Anasagunticook since it is the drinking water source for 230 households. An algae bloom would impact water quality to such an extent that it would likely increase treatment costs at the Canton Water District in order to continue producing potable drinking water.

These grants allow for the sharing of costs, usually on a 50-50 basis, to implement erosion control with the towns, private road associations, and property owners. The grant project that ended in 2023 tackled many, but not all, of the most significant erosion sites in the Lake Anasagunticook Watershed. Thus, the need for another grant to finish the job. Continuing erosion control efforts is a high priority of the LAA board and membership.

Funds come from Section 319 of the Clean Water Act, which deals with nonpoint source pollution – also known as erosion. Runoff from a hillside is an example of this diffuse type of pollution, as opposed to the more familiar point source pollution that comes from a discrete pipe at the tail end of, say, a factory. Maine's share of these federal 319 funds is disbursed to the DEP, which then awards them annually in a competitive grant application process.

We are very glad to again have Jeff Stern guiding us through the grant application process!

Want to know how you can help ensure we get the funds?

What we need is a financial commitment from YOU!

The funds the Lake Association raises are matched by Federal funds (to a certain point). LAA board members have been approaching businesses, and the towns of both Hartford and Canton have contributed.

What we need are individuals to commit to specific dollar contributions over the next 2 years – but the pledge needs to be made NOW! (cont'd on page 5)

(cont'd from page 4) We also need individuals to pledge "in-kind" matching - which is time or equipment.

Again, these pledges will be matched by federal funds, so the more we raise, the better off will be. Keep in mind that households that tackle approved mitigation projects on their property are eligible to receive up to \$300 in cash matches, so you will see direct results of your donation in our community. Of course, if needed, the LAA can rally friends and neighbors to help tackle projects you can't take on alone!
